

# Shifting Demographics By the Numbers: Suicides & Successful Interventions at the Golden Gate Bridge

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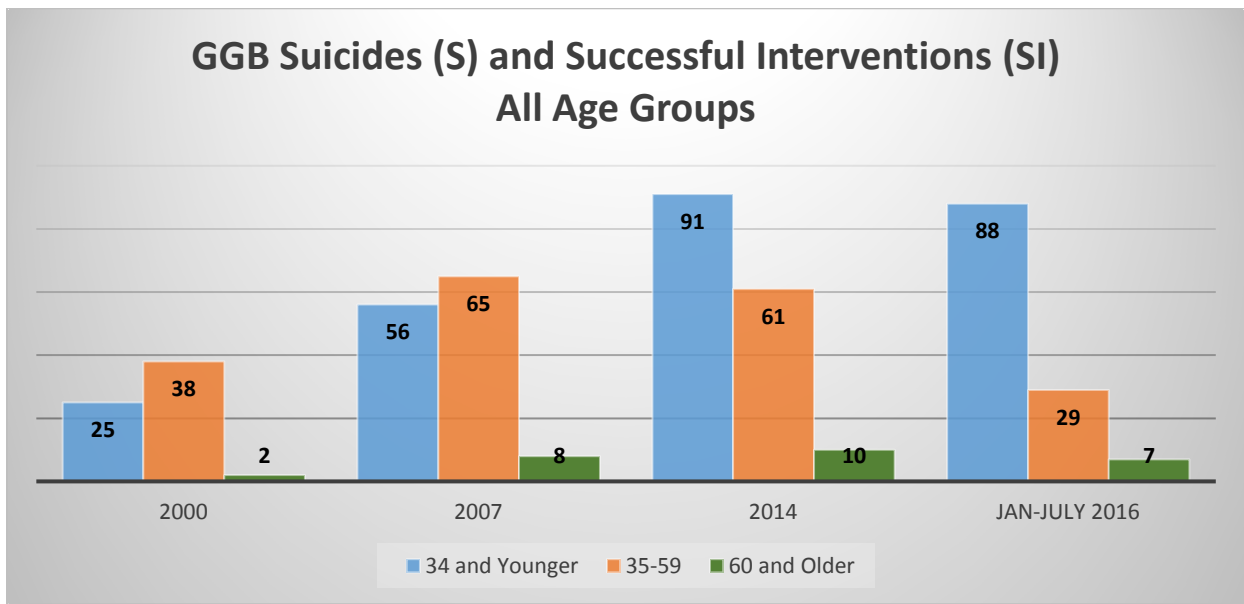
Those coming to the Golden Gate Bridge to commit suicide are younger than ever. Since 2000, the number of troubled young people under 25 years old showing up at the Bridge considering suicide has increased five-fold, from 9 people in 2000 to 43 in 2014, to being on track to an even higher number this year.

The following data provides information from sample years. Please note that as 2016 numbers are not yet complete, the charts provide data from January-July of 2016.\* The information has been compiled by the Bridge Patrol Department of the Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District.

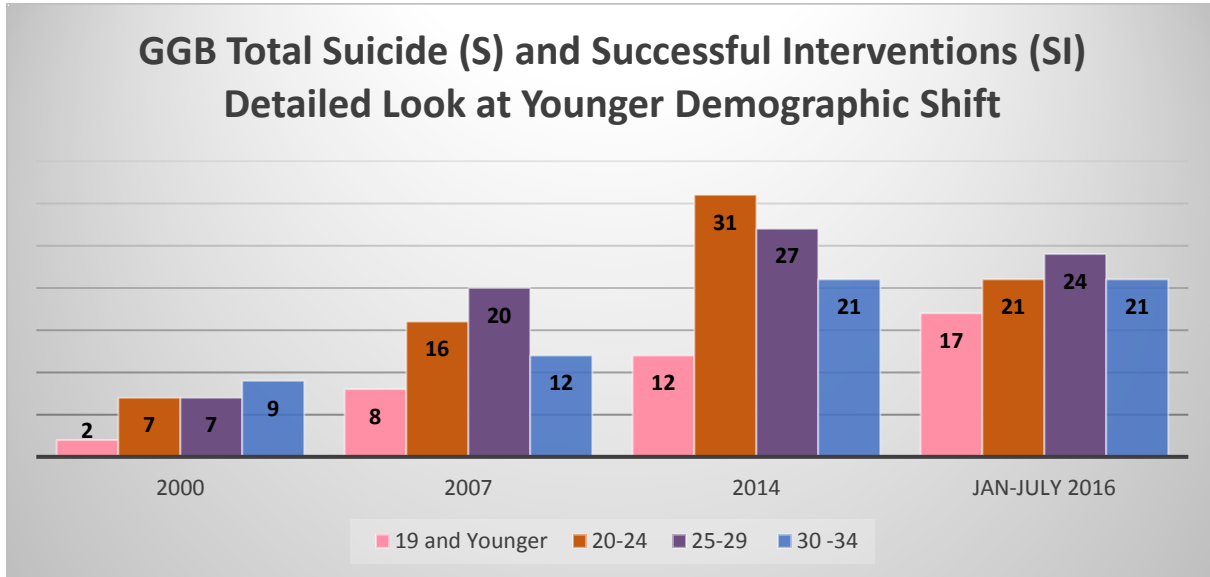

Golden Gate Bridge Patrol and Crisis Text Line will work together to dispatch emergency services and bring people to safety, using the keyword GGB. The new text line is in addition to the work of our current Bridge Patrols and phone hotlines.
